Epistle: Ephesians 5:22-33

Wives, submit to your own husbands, as to the Lord. For the husband is the head of the wife even as Christ is the head of the church, his body, and is himself its Savior. Now as the church submits to Christ, so also wives should submit in everything to their husbands.

Husbands, love your wives, as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her, that he might sanctify her, having cleansed her by the washing of water with the word, so that he might present the church to himself in splendor, without spot or wrinkle or any such thing, that she might be holy and without blemish. In the same way husbands should love their wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself. For no one ever hated his own flesh, but nourishes and cherishes it, just as Christ does the church, because we are members of his body. The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, the 5th chapter.

Glory be to Thee, O Lord. (sung)

[Jesus said,] "Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I have not come to abolish them but to fulfill them. For truly, I say to you, until heaven and earth pass away, not an iota, not a dot, will pass from the Law until all is accomplished. Therefore whoever relaxes one of the least of these commandments and teaches others to do the same will be called least in the kingdom of heaven, but whoever does them and teaches them will be called great in the kingdom of heaven. For I tell you, unless your righteousness exceeds that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven.

"You have heard that it was said to those of old, 'You shall not murder; and whoever murders will be liable to judgment.' But I say to you that everyone who is angry with his brother will be liable to judgment; whoever insults his brother will be liable to the council; and whoever says, 'You fool!' will be liable to the hell of fire. So if you are offering your gift at the altar and there remember that your brother has something against you, leave your gift there before the altar and go. First be reconciled to your brother, and then come and offer your gift. Come to terms quickly with your accuser while you are going with him to court, lest your accuser hand you over to the judge, and the judge to the guard, and you be put in prison. Truly, I say to you, you will never get out until you have paid the last penny.

"You have heard that it was said, 'You shall not commit adultery.' But I say to you that everyone who looks at a woman with lustful intent has already committed adultery with her in his heart. If your right eye causes you to sin, tear it out and throw it away. For it is better that you lose one of your members than that your whole body be thrown into hell. And if your right hand causes you to sin, cut it off and throw it away. For it is better that you lose one of your members than that your whole body go into hell.

"It was also said, 'Whoever divorces his wife, let him give her a certificate of divorce.' But I say to you that everyone who divorces his wife, except on the ground of sexual immorality, makes her commit adultery. And whoever marries a divorced woman commits adultery."

RIDER SCHWIEGER IS A 2009 GRADUATE OF ST. PAUL LUTHERAN **SCHOOL.** On Tuesday, November 21, 2023 Rider woke up with a headache that caused continuous vomiting. He went to the ER and it was discovered that he had a brain tumor and three cysts. The largest cyst was the size of a clementine. Rider had a ten-hour surgery on Wednesday, November 22nd. He then spent about three weeks in the critical care unit. They needed to hourly monitor the amount of fluids being drained from his brain. Too little or too much could be fatal. From there, Rider went to rehabilitation for a few days. While there, fluid started to build up. A second surgery became necessary. This five-hour surgery was to put in a shunt. With this in place, Rider can have the drain adjusted as needed. Rider spent a total of 26 days in the hospital. He continues to improve with weekly OT, PT, and speech therapy. To help with the high medical expenses Rider has incurred, we have designated all money raised during our National Lutheran Schools' Week penny wars to go to him. Containers will be placed outside the school office from January 22-26. Any coins or paper money may be given. RECITE the Verse of the Week: Psalm 103:1-3—Bless the LORD, O my soul, and all that is within me, bless his holy name! Bless the LORD, O my soul, and forget not all his benefits, who forgives all your iniquity, who heals all your diseases.

PRAY the Psalm of the Week: Psalm 139:13-16 READ from Small Catechism—The Sacrament of Holy Baptism: (3rd+) What does such baptizing with water indicate? It indicates that the Old Adam in us should by daily contrition and repentance be drowned and die with all sins and evil desires, and that a new man should daily emerge and arise to live before God in righteousness and purity forever. Where is this written? (1st+) St. Paul writes in Romans chapter six: (K+) We were therefore buried with Him through baptism into death (2nd+) in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life.
