James was one of the four fishermen called to be disciples. James and his brother, John, were the "sons of Zebedee" (Luke 5:10). James got to hear Jesus teach about the kingdom of God. James was the first of the 12 Apostles who was killed (martyred) for preaching and teaching about Jesus. Still today there are places in the world where Christians are put in prison, tortured and even killed for sharing that Jesus is the only Savior from sin. We pray for the courage to speak boldly about Jesus and to even be willing to suffer for Him.

### Small Catechism

10th COMMANDMENT

*What does this mean?*

We should fear and love God so that we do not entice or force away our neighbor's wife, workers, or animals, or turn them against him, but urge them to stay and do their duty.
