### “An Easter Inheritance”

Dear Friends in Christ,

When my family gathered in Illinois in February for my father’s funeral, something that was not on my mind was receiving any inheritance. My mother is still living and all that was my father’s is hers. But there were a few items that I brought home with me from the funeral that my mother gave me. One was a Taiwanese wood statue of father time and baby time that I was fascinated with as a child and played with a lot. The other was a diamond ring that my father often wore. My father’s ring was actually inherited from his godfather (sponsor) when he died. I have received some of my inheritance already. When I die, I plan to give that ring to my son as part of his inheritance. The nature of an inheritance is that it is received because someone died and left it to an heir.

As Lent draws to a close and we are preparing to celebrate Easter, we are minded of our inheritance as God’s children that becomes ours because Jesus, God’s Son, has died. On Maundy Thursday, the night before His death, Jesus read His “last will and testament” to His disciples gathered around the table. What did Jesus leave His disciples in His will? “This is My body which is given for you... This cup is the new [last will and] testament in My blood which is shed for you for the forgiveness of your sins.” Jesus left His body and blood to the Church in His will. We receive that inheritance each time we go to Communion, along with the promise of our full inheritance one day.

Peter in his First Epistle reminds us that there is more inheritance to come, which has an Easter component. “Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! According to his great mercy, he has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, to an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading, kept in heaven for you, who by God’s power are being guarded through faith for a salvation ready to be revealed in the last time” (1:3-5).

When Jesus rose from the dead in His body, He revealed to us that our Easter inheritance will be to rise from the dead in our bodies. Jesus has died, risen, and ascended into heaven where our inheritance is kept for us. We all will die in our bodies. Christian souls will go to heaven and await their full inheritance of the resurrection of their bodies on the last day, bodies glorified like their Lord’s glorious body.

The diamond ring I inherited from my father is part of the old creation, which will pass away one day. God has made us new creations in Christ capable of inheriting life forever.

## Whose Is It Anyway?

If you have ever bought or sold a house, you are acquainted with the concept of a “title search.” Before you can sell your house, and before anyone else will feel comfortable putting down the money to buy it, you have to prove that you really own it. So a title company looks through the public records to ensure that you bought it from the person who really owned it, who bought it from the person who really owned it before that, all the way back to the earliest records of your state, including when your state was only a territory or colony of England.

Peak into a preschool classroom during playtime and you’ll see a simplified version of this. A child starts playing with a ball, but another child says, “That’s mine: I had it first.”

You can’t understand the Seventh Commandment without understanding this concept of ownership or title. As the Small Catechism puts it:

You shall not steal. What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not take our neighbor’s money or possessions, or get them in any dishonest way, but help him to improve and protect his possessions and income.

Your neighbor’s possessions are his: you don’t have a right to take them. And likewise, your possessions are yours. Ownership and property rights are foundational to any functioning society.

But there is something deeper to know about ownership, and that is the question of who has the title and ownership to you? Paul says, “Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God? You are not your own, for you were bought with a price” (1 Cor. 6:19–20).

If you yourself are owned by God, then of course everything that you own, you really only possess by God’s leave: all of it, at bottom, belongs to Him since you belong to Him. For you were bought with the blood of Christ.

This notion is the foundation of all Christian stewardship. It all belongs to God. It should all be used for things that bring honor to His name, blessings to our neighbors and the extension of His kingdom.

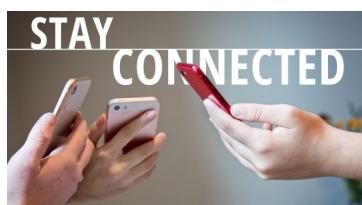
