

"The Dark Season of Advent"

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The day with the least amount of sunlight (winter solstice) falls each year just a few days before Christmas. The Advent weeks before Christmas draw on the theme of darkness and the Light of Christ breaking in. As we prepare to celebrate the Lord's birth, we realize that our sinful lives have so much darkness in them. We and this world need some Light. In the beginning, the uncreated Light created light in the darkness, "*Let there be light*!" At Christmas the uncreated Light breaks into the darkness around us, darkness that will not last forever since the End is coming (another Advent theme). St. Paul encourages us in these dark days: *The night is far gone; the day is at hand. So then let us cast off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light* (Rom. 13:12).

In the dark days leading up to the Second World War, a German Lutheran man married to a Jewish widow with a daughter, Jochen Klepper (1903-42), wrote "The Night Will Soon Be Ending" (*LSB* 337). A new translation from German to English was prepared for *Hymnal Supplement* 98, a book in preparation for *Lutheran Service Book*, our "new" hymnal (which turned 17 years old in October). The tune originally set to the text was considered difficult enough that it would likely prevent congregations from learning it, so a Welsh melody of the 19th century was set to it. Though the hymn is not scheduled to be sung this year, I encourage you to meditate on it throughout Advent, Christmas and Epiphany.

- The night will soon be ending; The dawn cannot be far.
 Let songs of praise ascending Now greet the Morning Star!
 All you whom darkness frightens With guilt or grief or pain,
 God's radiant Star now brightens And bids you sing again.
- The One whom angels tended Comes near, a child, to serve; Thus God, the judge offended, Bears all our sins deserve.
 The guilty need not cower, For God has reconciled
 - Through His redemptive power All those who trust this child.
- 3 The earth in sure rotation Will soon bring morning bright, So run where God's salvation Glows in a stable's light.
 As old as sin's perversion Is mercy's vast design: God brings a new creation— This child its seal and sign.
- 4 Yet nights will bring their sadness And rob our hearts of peace, And sin in all its madness Around us may increase.
 But now one Star is beaming Whose rays have pierced the night: God comes for our redeeming From sin's oppressive might.
- God dwells with us in darkness And makes the night as day; Yet we resist the brightness And turn from God away.
 But grace does not forsake us, However far we run.
 God claims us still as children Through Mary's infant Son.



If you open up the Small Catechism, you'll find a shortened version of the Third Commandment: "Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy." But if you look up the list of the Ten Commandments in Exodus, you'll find the full version:

Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. Six days you shall labor, and do all your work, but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the LORD your God. On it you shall not do any work, you, or your son, or your daughter, your male servant, or your female servant, or your livestock, or the sojourner who is within your gates. For in six days the LORD made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, and rested on the seventh day. Therefore the LORD blessed the Sabbath day and made it holy. (Ex. 20:8-11)

Why did Luther shorten this commandment for the Small Catechism? Was it so that the kids wouldn't have so much to memorize? No, it was



because Luther knew that all the details of the Third Commandment were part of the "shadow" of the Old Testament (Col. 2:16). Or as St. Paul puts it, there is "letter" in the Old Testament law and "spirit" (2 Cor. 3:6). The details of not working on Saturday were fulfilled by Christ. That part of the Sabbath regulation no longer applies. But the spirit of the law does

remain: We need to dedicate sufficient time each week to hearing God's Word and giving it honor and respect. Or as Luther sums it up in the Small Catechism's explanation to the Third Commandment: "We should fear and love God so that we do not despise preaching and His Word but hold it sacred and gladly hear and learn it."

The same sort of analysis applies to our giving. In the Old Testament, God commanded the Israelites to give a tenth of their income to the Levites so that those men could dedicate their lives to serving in God's house, teaching the people, conducting worship, etc. In the New Testament, there is not a rigid requirement listed about handing in your tax forms to church to make sure you've given enough. But the mandate to have a full-time ministry, which is the spirit of that law concerning tithing to the Levites, is right there in 1 Corinthians 9:14: "The Lord has ordained that those who preach the Gospel should make their living from the Gospel."

The New Testament church's job is significantly larger than the job of Old Testament Israel. We are commanded to preach the Gospel to all nations. There was only the temple to maintain in the Old Testament, but we have churches, schools, universities and seminaries, plus missionaries everywhere. So you tell me: Can we really undertake the work of the ministry if our giving doesn't even measure up to Old Testament levels of generosity?
