"The Ten Commandments, Part 3"

Dear Friends in Christ.

Lent is almost upon us. (Easter arrives early this year, March 31!) On February 14, we will leave the "Time of Christmas" (Advent—Epiphany seasons) and start the "Time of Easter" (Ash Wednesday—Holy Pentecost). Before the Divine Service on Ash Wednesday, we will offer again the Imposition of Ashes for those who desire it. This will begin at 6:15 PM and last about five minutes, and the Divine Service will follow at 6:30 PM.

At the Lenten Midweek Services starting February 21, we will conclude the series on the Ten Commandments I started two years ago: Seventh (2/21), Eighth (2/28), Ninth-Tenth (3/6), and the Close of the Commandments (3/13). The last midweek service before Holy Week will be the Sunday School Lent-Easter program, "The Promise Fulfilled" (3/20). Also watch for information about the Lenten Suppers being held before the services.

There is a long tradition among Lutherans of holding special midweek Lenten services. I hope you take advantage of them. I realize that it can be difficult for families with children (young and old alike) to add another activity to their schedule, but I think it is important that children are raised with the good habit of structuring daily life around God's Word, times and seasons in the Church. Christians consider gathering for worship an opportunity to hear and learn God's Word, not as obligations they are forced to endure. With King David we declare, *I* was glad when they said to me, "Let us go to the house of the LORD!" (Psalm 122:1)

- 1. **Weight Loss & Health** A number of people have asked me if I am well because I have lost weight. Thank you for your concern! The weight loss is intentional, not sickness-related. About six months ago Deb and I started eating healthier, and both of us have had good success.
- 2. **New Home** I have heard there is a rumor "out there" that we are selling our house and moving, which is true, but <u>not</u> to move away from Fairmont. We have purchased a lot in town (819 Reiman Court) and are planning to build a new home there, starting construction in the spring. LWML Mites Report for 2023



Caring for My Neighbor

If any of the Ten Commandments might tempt us to think that keeping the Law is easy, it would be the Fifth Commandment. After all, how hard is it to get through life without murdering somebody? The vast majority of people can handle that!

But Jesus famously blows up this notion by pointing out that the command, "you shall not murder," goes much deeper — down to the heart.

"You have heard that it was said to those of old, 'You shall not murder; and whoever murders will be liable to judgment.' But I say to you that everyone who is angry with his brother will be liable to judgment; whoever insults his brother will be liable to the council; and whoever says, 'You fool!' will be liable to the hell of fire." (Matt. 5:21-22)

Hatred and disdain come from the same sort of crookedness of heart as murder. With both murder and hatred, you look down on another person and think them of little worth.

In the Small Catechism, Luther also points out that every "do not" in the commandments also includes a "do this:" "We should fear and love God so that we do not hurt or harm our neighbor in his body but *help and support him in every physical need*" (SC, Fifth Commandment, emphasis added).

We are not called merely to avoid evil; we must also do positive good.

So when Jesus drew near to us and became our neighbor by taking up our humanity, He

came not only to avoid harming us, but He came to positively help us, bless us, and serve us.

We are now called to show the love to our neighbors that Christ showed to us. Your neighbor is yet another gift that God has given you that requires your stewardship. We are called to show mercy, to be kind, to love and serve our neighbor. One aspect of this stewardship is financial: our neighbors need us to support the church's work so that they can hear the Gospel and come to faith. Our neighbors need the church's alms and mercy work. Our neighbors need our faithful service in all we do in the name of Christ.


