"The Minnesota Summer Sabbath"

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,


After long, cold winters and hesitant springtimes, Minnesotans are ready for summer, and summer, at last, has arrived! After huddling in our homes for months and only venturing out within closed vehicles when necessary, we now see people enjoying the outdoors. For those who hate the cold (and I'm married to one) the warmth of summer is a welcome relief. After what seems like six months of winter we are ready for a rest from it, a Sabbath from winter.

The word "Sabbath" comes from the Hebrew word for "rest" and goes back to the very beginning of creation when God worked for six days creating and then rested on the seventh, blessing it and making it holy, setting aside the Sabbath day as something special (Gen. 2:3). When God established the nation of Israel, He made laws for His people to follow, establishing the Sabbath as a day of rest for all people and animals.

While on the Exodus to the Promised Land, the Creator provided manna, bread from heaven, for the people to eat, but only on the first six days of the week. Each of the first five days, enough manna was to be gathered just for that day; extra manna kept for a second day turned rotten and filled with worms. God wanted His people to trust Him to keep on providing. But on the sixth day, the people were supposed to collect enough manna for that day and the next, the Sabbath when they were to rest. Only on the Sabbath would manna collected the previous day not rot. Jesus quoted Deuteronomy 8:3 when the devil tempted Him to turn stones into bread. And [the LORD] humbled you and let you hunger and fed you with manna, which you did not know, nor did your fathers know, that he might make you know that man does not live by bread alone, but man lives by every word that comes from the mouth of the LORD.

Jesus fulfilled the Sabbath laws by suffering and dying on the sixth day (Good Friday), resting from His work of salvation in the tomb on the Sabbath (Saturday),

and then rising victorious on the first day of the week (Easter Sunday), beginning a new day for all creation that will never end. There is no longer a divine law that restricts us from working on any day of the week because Jesus is now our Sabbath. The writer to the Hebrews reminds us that God's Word remains to be heard on the Sabbath. So then, there remains a Sabbath rest for the people of God, for whoever has entered God's rest has also rested from his works as God did from His. Let us therefore strive to enter that rest, so that no one may fall by the same sort of disobedience. For the word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing to the division of soul and of spirit, of joints and of



Just like God preserved manna for the Israelites to enjoy during their Sabbath rest, God has preserved for us in the Church a Sabbath rest when we can be fed and refreshed with His holy Word and Sacrament, the Bread from heaven. Our need for this does not go away during the summer months. God has blessed us with the Minnesota summer Sabbath from winter, but not so we give up finding our rest in Jesus. See you in church throughout the summer months!

What Do You Want?

One of the best-known and most-beloved psalms is Psalm 23, the "Shepherd Psalm." There we learn that the Lord is our Shepherd. And since He is our Shepherd, we will not want. We will not suffer want because the Lord, our Shepherd, will lead us to green pastures and beside still waters. In other words, the Lord, our Shepherd, will provide for all that we need in both body and soul.

Yet, we live as though this is not the case. We live as though we *actually* suffer from want, that the Lord, our Shepherd, will not provide for all that we need. And thus, we live as though the Lord is not our Shepherd. And that means that we live as though we are not the Lord's sheep.

He makes me

green pastures; he leads me beside

still waters ...

Psalm 23:2, NRSV

When do we live as though the Lord is not our Shepherd? When we put anything else before Him and His provision for us. When we think that going to work is more important than receiving His gifts in church on Sunday (in violation of the First and Third Commandments). When we fail to give generously of the first fruits of what the Lord has provided for us because we don't know what the future will bring (even though He has promised that He will lead us to green pastures and still waters).

We live as though we are not the Lord's sheep when we think that the Lord is only in the business of helping those who will help themselves. We act this way because our minds are set on earthly

those who will help themselves. We act this way because our minds are set on earthly, temporal things and not on heavenly, eternal things. We act this way because we have stopped hearing the call of our Shepherd, which comes through His Word.

Through the Word of God, the Shepherd calls us to Himself. Through the Word, the Holy Spirit gathers and enlightens us with His gifts. Through the Word, we are kept holy and nourished in the one true faith, the faith that follows our Shepherd wherever He leads us. He promises to lead us to our true home, to the land flowing with milk and honey, to a better country, not of this world, but a heavenly one.

And so, here's the Good News: the Lord is your Shepherd, even and especially for wayward sheep. For Jesus seeks and saves those who are lost. He finds the lost sheep and carries them back to the fold. He is the Shepherd who lays down His life for His sheep. The Lord is your Shepherd. Let us live as His sheep.


