

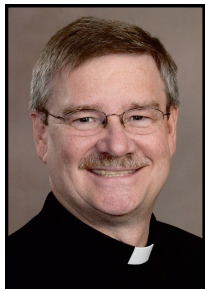

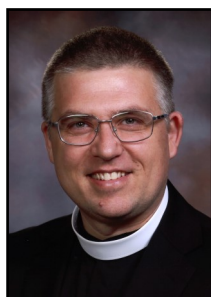

“A Summer Sabbath”

Dear Friends in Christ,

The Hebrew word “sabbath” basically means “rest.” God rested on the seventh day after completing His creating work. God commanded that the Israelites not work on the Sabbath Day to remember God and what He had done for them. God included work animals as needing rest as well as humans. After Jesus completed His work of salvation and died on the cross, He was buried and His body rested in the tomb until He rose from the dead on Easter, the first day of the week.

Many Minnesotans look at the summer months as a long sabbath to recover from the cold months of the year, resting up from it, refreshing and renewing themselves in preparation for the next long winter. If you like being outdoors but don’t like the cold, you want to take advantage of every moment of the beautiful weather while it lasts. This is understandable.

At the same time, when God commanded a sabbath-rest for His people, He never intended it to be a rest from being in His house to hear and learn His Word and receive His gifts in the Sacrament of the Altar. For some reason, many Christians apparently don’t think they need as much of God during the summer months based on how often they attend services in Church. It is almost as if they think of worship as a “chore” or “work” from which they need a rest. This is the opposite of the truth.

When we come to church to worship God, we enter into His rest. He takes from us all the burdens we are carrying. He relieves us of our sin. We give Him what is worrying us so we don’t have to worry anymore. God gives us fellow Christians to love and support us as we gather before Him. This might give us some added work to do – even on the “sabbath” – since God might use us to carry each other’s burdens out of love for them. We are in this together so others do the same for us.

Rooted in Christ, Growing in Stewardship

The heartland is now awash in various hues of green. The doldrums of winter give way to the colors of spring. Now, the promise of spring gives way to the growth of summer. Fields are planted and sprouted. Gardens are planted. Flowers adorn the beds of neighborhood homes and roadside ditches. Green is the shade of life!

Green growth is also the hue of the faithful steward. The seed of faith planted in human hearts in the waters of Holy Baptism grows as it is nurtured in the Word proclaimed and ingested in the Holy Supper. This faith does indeed save. But our stewardship of the Gospel is also designed to bear fruit for God's glory and the benefit of our neighbor.

To consider this, let us look at the hymn, "Fruitful Trees, the Spirits Sowing" (LSB 691). It is very much a stewardship hymn!

Fruitful trees, the Spirit's sowing, May we ripen and increase, Fruit to life eternal growing, rich in love and joy and peace.

- Our stewardship is NOT about what we do. It is about what the Holy Spirit does in and through us. That is the fruit that we bear. His fruit for His purposes.
- But that fruit is lived out through us. The world sees the fruit of our stewardship of the Gospel in lives lived connected to Word and Sacrament.

Rooted deep in Christ our Master, Christ our pattern and our goal, Teach us, as the years fly faster, Goodness, faith, and self-control.

- Stewards have been created and redeemed to reflect the image of Jesus in the world. He is the pattern. We reflect to others around us the Light of the Gospel He has shone on us.
- This reflection comes when Christ's goodness flows from us to others.

Fruitful trees, the Spirit's tending, May we grow till harvests cease; Till we taste, in life unending, Heaven's love and joy and peace.

- Just as the Spirit has created us for stewardship of the Gospel, so also does He cause our faithfulness! He calls, gathers, enlightens, sanctifies and KEEPS us in this faithful stewardship of the Gospel.
- The ultimate goal of our faithful stewardship is eternity. For us. For our neighbor. All worked out by the Spirit.

Green is the color of the world right now. It is also the color of our stewardship and it is growing in us as we are connected to the vine, Jesus! God grant our growth in Him!

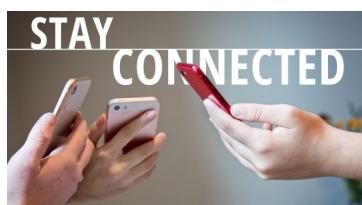

Families receiving care at any Twin Cities area hospital are eligible to stay there, provided their children are being treated for cancer or have other life-threatening illnesses and the family resides 45 miles or greater from the Twin Cities. Yearly, more than 600 families stay there.
