## Pastor Adam Welton Extended Call as Second SPL Pastor

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In Ephesians 4:11 it says that God “*gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the pastors and teachers.*” The Church today describes the men who serve as pastors as in the “Office of the Holy Ministry.” That it is an “office” reminds us that the man is given a position of responsibility. That it is “holy” reminds us that he is about God’s “business” of preaching and teaching the Word of God and administering the sacraments according to the Gospel. That it is a “ministry” reminds us that the man is called to be servant of God in the congregation.

At the Special Congregational Assembly meeting Wednesday, May 25, four candidates for pastor were recommended to the congregation by the Council of Deacons, which serves as the pastoral Call Committee. Three of them were accepted unanimously by the Assembly following discussion, as required by the Bylaws, and the names were placed into a hat and one drawn. Pastor Adam Welton was chosen by lot to serve as the next shepherd of our congregation.

Rev. Welton has served as sole pastor at St. Peter Lutheran Church, Wentworth, South Dakota, since 2018. He is a 2013 graduate of Concordia Theological Seminary, Ft. Wayne. He is married to Kayla (2007), and they have three children born from 2009-2015.

In this time between the extension of this call and a decision, we pray God’s blessings on Pastor Welton and his family as he prayerfully considers the two divine calls he now has, his current call at St. Peter and the call to serve here. We ask God to be with our two congregations and lead Pastor Welton in a decision about how to best serve our Lord’s Church. Pastor Welton might visit Fairmont as part of his deliberation.

## So, Your Congregation needs a new Music Director? To quote, Luther,... "What does this mean"?

According to our handbook, "Policies of the Congregation", The job description has 5 categories (A- E), can be found on pages 29- 31, and the job description was revised by the Congregational Assembly on 4-23-14. BESIDES being a teacher, & in the interests of length/ time, only a listing of the duties as described under item D appear below.

1. To serve as chief organist for the congregation, but also to recruit and make use of available talent in the congregation with the limits of additional funds allotted for this in the annual budget.
2. To promote and direct the choirs of St. Paul Lutheran Church, namely the adult and hand bell choirs; to work to maintain a music schedule for choirs and organist, which though not necessarily directed by him/her are to be supervised by him/her in coordination with the pastors and responsible boards.
3. To be in charge of the school music program and to work this out in consultation with the principal and faculty in conformity with the congregation's overall music program and under the specific control of the Board of Education—Lutheran School.
4. To make the best possible use of musical talent within the congregation which may be available on a volunteer basis, especially for special services. This refers to instrumental music, vocal solos, etc., development of youth choirs, handbell music, etc., as time and circumstances in this direction may permit.
5. To play for weddings, funerals, and other special events, unless other arrangements are made by families involved in consultation with the pastors. (St. Paul allows other qualified organists, soloists, and musicians to function at such events.) It is understood that the families involved for such special events are to remunerate the organist for such special services.

bless his holy name!

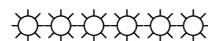

## What Do You Have That You Have Not Received?

Some of the disciples of John the Baptist were questioning him about the baptism and preaching of Jesus. John the Baptist replies to their questions in this way: "A person cannot receive even one thing unless it is given him from heaven" (John 3:27).

Now, John the Baptist says this to show that Jesus, His teaching, and His baptism are from heaven. But this statement is true of everything – everything that we have and are in body and soul. In fact, this is what we are taught in the meaning of the Apostles' Creed in *Luther's Small Catechism*.

In the explanation of the Creed's First Article, we learn that God has made us and everything in the universe. Luther says:

"He has given me my body and soul, eyes, ears, and all my members, my reason and all my senses, and still takes care of them. He also gives me clothing and shoes, food and drink, house and home, wife and children, land, animals, and all I have. He richly and daily provides me with all that I need to support this body and life. He defends me against all danger and guards and protects me from all evil. All this He does only out of fatherly, divine goodness and mercy, without any merit or worthiness in me. For all this it is my duty to thank and praise, serve and obey Him."

In the Second Article of the Creed, we learn that God sent His Son, Jesus, to humble Himself, taking the form of a servant. Luther writes:

"(Jesus) has redeemed me, a lost and condemned person, purchased and won me from all sins, from death, and from the power of the devil; not with gold or silver, but with His holy, precious blood and with His innocent suffering and death, that I may be His own and live under Him in His kingdom and serve Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness, just as He is risen from the dead, lives and reigns to all eternity."

In the Third Article of the Creed, we learn that the fruits of what Jesus Christ, the Son of God, did are given to us through the work of the Holy Spirit in the Church. Luther explains:

"That I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith. In the same way He calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies the whole Christian church on earth, and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one true faith. In this Christian church He daily and richly forgives all my sins and the sins of all believers. On the Last Day He will raise me and all the dead, and give eternal life to me and all believers in Christ."

Indeed, a person cannot receive even one thing unless it is given him from heaven. But how easy is this for us to forget about this?

How easy is it for us to think that what we have in this life is because we have earned it? How easy is it for us to forget that even all our skills, the abilities of our hands and minds – the very ethic to work diligently and to seek to get better at these skills – is given to us from heaven, just as John the Baptist said? How easy is it for us to forget that it is Christ alone – and the work of the Holy Spirit – that reveals His salvation to us, delivers it to us, and not our doing?

Sure, we have responsibility for coming to church, for delving into God's Holy Word, and for praying without ceasing. But even these responsibilities are given to us from heaven, not to earn anything but in response to what He has accomplished for us.

A person cannot receive one thing unless it is given to him from heaven. Everything we have, and everything we are – in both body and soul – are gifts from God in heaven. Let us then respond in thanksgiving and give back to Him as He asks us to – with a first-fruits, generous proportion offering of what He has given to us.

Receipts must be from Fairmont stores only; remember to thank the stores for this program when you shop!
