Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I have been reading a wonderful book entitled **The Everlasting Man**, written by G.K. Chesterton. In a section I recently finished, he discussed how secularism, the proposition that any reference to God be made, if at all, merely a private concern, actually is inhibitive and offers a truncated view of man. Rather than elevating man, it diminishes him. In favor of the centrality of the public worship of the true and living God, Chesterton wrote about that man who worships:

"He not only felt freer when he bent; he actually felt taller when he bowed...anything that took away the gesture of worship would stunt and even maim him forever. Henceforth being merely secular would be a servitude and an inhibition. If man cannot pray he is gagged; if he cannot kneel he is in irons."

It is so very true that when we debase God and move Him out of the picture, we are debasing man.

And so what a joy it is that we are free to gather around the Gospel and the Sacraments and worship the Holy Trinity! Let us spit out the gag and shake off the irons. All the more so as Lent is upon us, with the additional opportunities for the increase of worship and devotion.



It is in the sack-cloth and ashes of a penitent faith that we are raised up with Christ and are clothed with His very own glory. Let us approach this season with repentant joy, and look forward in eager anticipation to its consummation on Easter Sunday.





School Fundraisers

COCA-COLA GIVE PROGRAM — This fundraiser opens up new funding opportunities to help the learning environment for our students. The best part? Donations don't come out of your own pocket. SCRIP FUNDRAISING Raise money for SPLS (or a specific family in our school) just by making purchases with scrip gift cards. Buy scrip gift cards and you receive the full value of what you paid. You also earn an immediate rebate percentage of what you spend — typically between 3% and 15%, depending on the retailer. Use the proceeds to supplement the school budget, or families can receive credit toward tuition and other school expenses. To shop online, go to shopwithscrip.com. Stop by the Welcome Center in the school hallway when the scrip table is present between Sunday services. Contact Joan Abel with any questions. Fareway grocery scrip cards now available!

KWIK TRIP SCRIP GIFT CARDS Gift cards are available for purchase in the church office. SPL School receives a percentage of all purchases made with these gift cards at the gas pump and inside the store. Available in \$10 to \$100 denominations. (It is preferred that you order these cards through the SCRIP program if possible; see above.)

HY-VEE & FAREWAY RECEIPTS Save your Fairmont Hy-Vee and Fareway receipts – turn in to the collection bins located in the upstairs school corridor and church basement. For each \$150,000 in receipts collected from their store, they donate \$1,000 to St. Paul Lutheran School. Receipts must be from Fairmont stores only; remember to thank the stores for this program when you shop!

SUBWAY CARDS If you purchase Subway cards, 2% of your purchase can go to SPLS. If you already have a card or when you purchase one, add our school's code (3TQF) to your card at www.subway.com or call 1-800-564-1343. Subway cards can be purchased at any Subway and are redeemed at full purchase price when you eat at Subway.

THE SCHOOL ALSO collects aluminum pop tabs to help support the Ronald McDonald House in the Twin Cities. Families receiving care at any Twin Cities area hospital are eligible to stay there, provided their children are being treated for cancer or have other life-threatening illnesses and the family resides 45 miles or greater from the Twin Cities. Yearly, more than 600 families stay there.

Stewardship Corner

We are at the beginning of Lent. During the Lenten season, the church calls to our attention the sufficiency of what God gives. It points to the sufficiency of God's grace in the atoning work of Jesus. It shows us the sufficiency of faith in Jesus' work for us. It makes known the sufficiency of God's Word in faith and life.


But Lent doesn't just remind us of the sufficiency of God's spiritual gifts, the gifts that

pertain to our redemption and salvation. Lent also reminds us of the sufficiency of the physical, temporal gifts of God, those that pertain to this body and life. In other words, it reminds us of the importance of godly contentment and of outward discipline and training of the body.

This outward training of the body teaches us not to give in to every desire of our flesh but to learn to say no to them. And it does this in such a way that if you fail, it is no sin. It is a way to practice without putting yourself into a compromising situation.


The easiest example of this is fasting. When you fast, you are practicing saying no to the desires of your body. But if you fail in this, if you break your fast, you have not sinned. You have, though, learned something about how your flesh works, how difficult it is to fight

against it, and how you need help from above in order to do it.



This is why St. Paul instructs young Pastor Timothy in this way:

"But godliness with contentment is great gain, for we brought nothing into the world, and we cannot take anything out of the world. But if we have food and clothing, with these we will be content. But those who desire to be rich fall into temptation, into a share, into many senseless and harmful desires that plunge people into ruin and destruction. For the



love of money is a root of all kinds of evils. It is through this craving that some have wandered away from the faith and pierced themselves with many pangs." (1 Tim. 6:6-10)

Our sufficiency is not of ourselves; it is in God. Let us learn this without sin by training our flesh this Lenten season.

To ensure that members' names are listed on the printed census for pastors, members need to ask the registration clerk to list their religion ("Lutheran") and religious affiliation ("St. Paul Lutheran, Fairmont").
