"What is Success for a Congregation?"

Dear Friends in Christ.

There are many ideas about what constitutes success in a congregation: A nice building, an enjoyable social experience, engaging worship, lots of people, lots of money. If a congregation has these things, then the congregation's future looks bright.

None of the successes that I mentioned, however, will be important when this world ends. What will matter at that time will be whether a person loves Jesus's appearing or dreads Jesus's appearing. Those who love his appearing are the ones who believe in him. Those who dread his appearing have not believed in him.

The Augsburg Confession, one of the Lutheran Church's important documents in the Book of Concord, speaks about how we can love Jesus's appearing on Judgment Day. The Augsburg Confession describes what God has instituted for his Church. It says:

In order that we may obtain this faith [in Jesus] the ministry of teaching the Gospel and administering the Sacraments was instituted. Through the Word and Sacraments, as though instruments, the Holy Spirit is given. The Holy Spirit works faith, where and when it pleases God, in those who hear the Gospel. The Gospel is that God, for Christ's sake, justifies those who believe that they are received into grace for Christ's sake. They are not justified by any merits of their own. \(^1\)

This teaching from our Lutheran Confessions shows us that the congregation should not be seen our own play-thing. God has given us what we are to do. The Word is to be taught, the sacraments are to be given out. Through the Word and the sacraments the Holy Spirit gives the gift of faith in Christ which justifies us before God. Through that justifying faith (and *only* through that justifying faith) we will not be ashamed or afraid when Christ comes to judge the living and the dead.

What success looks like in a Christian congregation is that the Gospel and Sacraments are being used, enjoyed, supported, talked about, and so on. Lots of other things inevitably happen in a congregation too. However, none of those other things are essential or eternal.

Whether a congregation is "successful" or not will not always be apparent in this life. Some congregations might appear to be successful now, but they will be revealed as unsuccessful on Judgment Day. Conversely, some congregations might appear unsuccessful now, but through God's Word and Sacraments there are believers in Jesus. Keeping a clear focus on what makes our congregation successful will enable us to help people truly and eternally.

Cherish What God Has Given

In the Small Catechism, Luther follows a pattern when explaining the Ten Commandments. With each commandment, there is something prohibited, and something commanded. There is something wrong which must be avoided, and there is something right which must be done.

The one time this pattern is not followed is with the Sixth Commandment.

"You shall not commit adultery. What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we lead a sexually pure and decent life in what we say and do, and husband and wife love and honor each other." (SC 1)

Here, the catechism focuses solely on the positive: we should live in a chaste and decent manner in both word and deed, and husbands and wives should cherish and honor one another.

Keeping this commandment, and all of the commandments, is a lot easier if you see your chastity and your spouse as a gift from God that is to be protected and cherished. In the same way, you will find keeping the Fourth Commandment easier if you see your parents and other authorities as a gift from God, given to you for your blessing.



This is the key stewardship insight that runs through all of the Christian life: Everything that we have has been given to us by God. We deserve none of it. All of it comes to us by God's fatherly kindness and open-handed generosity. If I know that everything I have — every possession, every relationship, every ability — is a gift from God, then my perspective changes. All of these things are both gifts to be cherished, and things that I should direct towards God's purposes. My possessions should be shared generously according to how God has called me in my family, church, and community. My spouse should be cherished, loved, and encouraged in faith. My children are on loan from my own Heavenly Father, and I have but a brief time to show them the path of righteousness. My neighbor is a gift from God so that I can imitate His kindness toward me.

No matter the gift, everything has been given to me by God so that I may participate in His own goodness and open-handed generosity.
