#### "Is the Lutheran Reformation still relevant today?"

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On October 31, 1517 Martin Luther nailed his 95 theses, or statements, against the sale of indulgences by the Roman Catholic Church. Luther's protest began a series of events that led to massive changes. European and World history

would never be the same. The pope's power was broken. Christians began to learn and believe the Bible for themselves. Christendom, unfortunately, would be splintered into countless denominations and groups. Farreaching consequences of the Lutheran Reformation continue to reverberate down to today.

Although the importance of the Reformation can hardly be under-estimated, I think it is helpful to remember why and how it all began. Although Europe and the world were changed by the Lutheran Reformation, Martin Luther was not trying to change the world. He was concerned about

people's faith. He was concerned about people believing falsely and going to hell as a result. Luther wanted people to believe what was true, to believe in Jesus Christ, and thereby be saved.

This can be seen with the issue that touched off the Reformation. The Roman Catholic Church has sold indulgences for centuries. (They still do, by the way!) An indulgence supposedly decreases the time that a person needs to spend in purgatory, and so on, but suffice it to say that people ended up believing that these certificates would do them a lot of good. In fact, people came to believe in these certificates *more* that what Jesus actually told us: "Repent and believe the Gospel" (Mark 1:15).

There is nothing more dangerous and harmful than believing in something that is fake instead of believing in what is divine and true. Lies do not help or save. Lies were what led Adam and Eve into sin and death. The truth saves. Jesus is the way, the truth, and the life (John 14:6). When Luther took on the false practice of selling indulgences on October 31, 1517, he was fighting against lies and what was worthless. He was fighting for what was true and beneficial. All that later came up during the Reformation should be seen in this light. Luther was not trying to make history (even though he did). He was trying to do what was right, true, godly, and Scriptural.

If God is gracious to us so that we follow in Luther's footsteps, then the Lutheran Reformation will always be relevant. Most people today do not believe in indulgences or purgatory. (Maybe you don't know very clearly what these things are!) But we still have plenty of false and worthless beliefs that threaten our souls and the souls of those we love. The truth of Jesus Christ, crucified for sinners, remains as relevant as it ever has been, too. "Lord, keep us steadfast in your Word!" (LSB 655)


