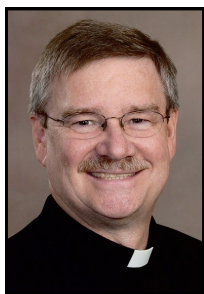

Nov. 5/6 All Saints' Commemoration of the Faithful Departed

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On the first Sunday in November each year we commemorate the “faithful departed” from our congregation, that is, all SPL congregation members who have died since the last “All Saints Sunday” the previous year (Nov. 7, 2021). As of this writing (Oct. 26), this totals 19 souls. (Two families chose not to hold funerals, one funeral was held in another state where the member had been living in a nursing home for a few years, and one funeral is scheduled for after Nov. 6.)

After each person is named at the service, the bell is tolled, and a Bible verse is read responsively by the pastor and the congregation. I find this to be, emotionally, one of the most difficult moments as a pastor. Each name I read is a sheep of the flock that was given to be to shepherd. For family members in attendance at the service, this commemoration must be even more difficult and sad. Yet, there is the joy of knowing that the souls of faithful departed, who are no longer with us here on earth, are with Jesus in the joys of paradise. We are separated now by death, but Christ has destroyed the power of death by His death and resurrection, and on the Last Day, will raise us all the dead and give eternal life to all who believe in Him.

The Commemoration ends with this beautiful prayer: “Almighty God, in whose glorious presence live all who depart in the Lord and before whom all the souls of the faithful who are delivered of the burden of the flesh are in joy and felicity, we give You hearty thanks for Your loving-kindness to all Your servants who have finished their course in faith and now rest from their labors, and we humbly implore Your mercy that we, together with all who have departed in the saving faith, may have our perfect consummation and bliss, in both body and soul, in Your eternal and everlasting glory; through Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.”

Call Updates

Pastor: On October 12 the congregation received the names and information of 15 pastors for consideration (Two pastors nominated by congregational members just accepted calls and are not available for consideration.) After Bible Class on October 30, the Council of Deacons (Pastor Call Committee) along with the SPL President will review all this information and identify all those pastors they think should be considered further. These pastors will be contacted to set up interviews by a subcommittee of the Call Committee and report back to the Entire Council their impressions. Following that discussion, those acceptable unanimously will be reported to the congregation for two successive Sundays, and Special Congregational Assembly meeting will be set to approve the slate and call a pastor. (See Bylaw Article I, for details)

What Makes for a Cheerful Giver?

St. Paul wrote to Church of Christ in Corinth: "Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver" (2 Cor. 9:7). God loves a cheerful giver. But who is a cheerful giver?

Abel was. By faith, he gave the firstborn of his flock, and it was acceptable in God's sight. Abraham was. By faith, he prepared cakes and a tender choice calf for God and entertained angels unaware. So also were David and Solomon. By faith, David would not make a sacrifice to God that cost him nothing, so he paid Araunah his due. By faith, Solomon built a house for God, where his name would dwell and thereby where He would dwell to be Israel's God and they His people.

Yearly, more than 600 families stay there.
